On the Agenda

A proposal to install art, in specific a wall mural, will be presented at the Board of Supervisors' March 16 Work Session. The project is a joint venture of the Township Parks & Recreation Committee and local students. The March 16 Business Meeting will include a public hearing to consider an addendum to the uniform pension plan. The ordinance is administrative, and does not affect plan benefits. The Work Session begins at 6 p.m., and the Business Meeting will follow at 7 p.m.

The Planning Commission will meet at 7 p.m. on March 26. The agenda is likely to include continued discussion on Toll Mid-Atlantic's proposed subdivision at South Chester Springs Road. Revised plans are expected to be submitted in early March, and will be posted to our website when received.

Spring Time is Fence Time

Around the time the swallows return to Capistrano in mid-March, the Township typically sees an uptick in new fence inquiries. To help you plan, here are the answers to our two most frequent questions:

- Do I need a permit? No, the Township does not require a permit for fences under six feet in height.
- Do I need a survey? Maybe. A survey may be required if there is a dispute or uncertainty regarding the property line location between neighbors.

Important Note: All fences must be located outside the road right-of-way. If you are unsure of the right-of-way width for your roadway, please call the Township Building. We are happy to assist you!
