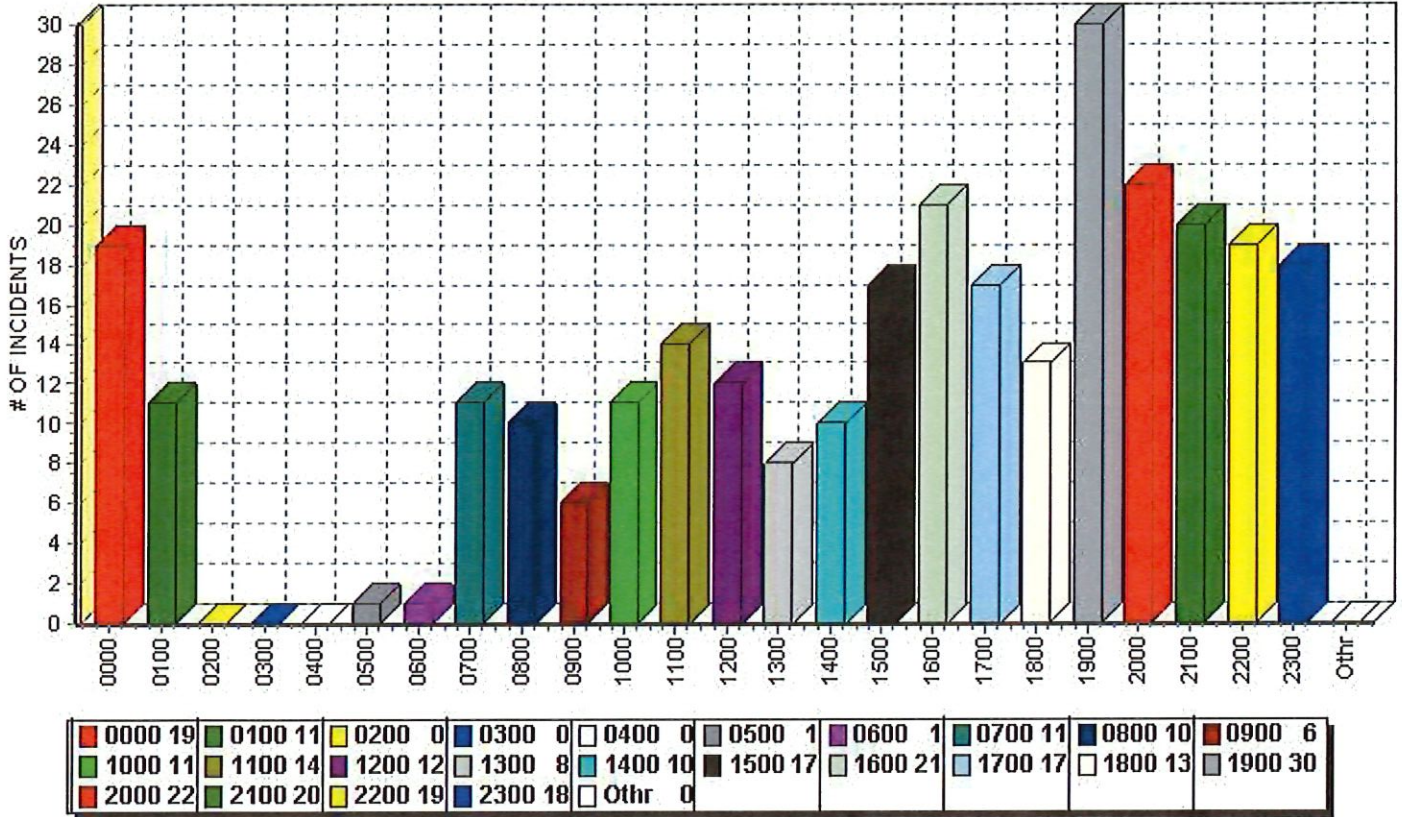

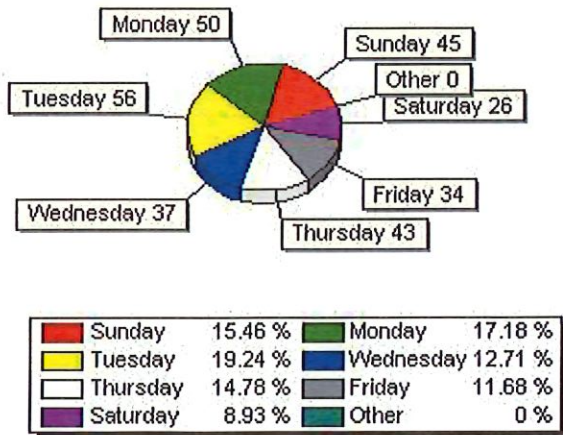

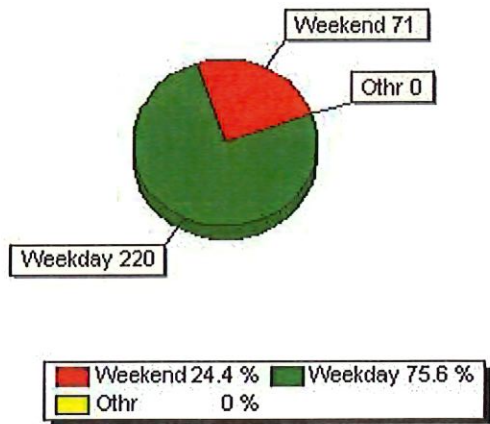
Incident Frequency by Hour of the Day (Using DATE RECD)

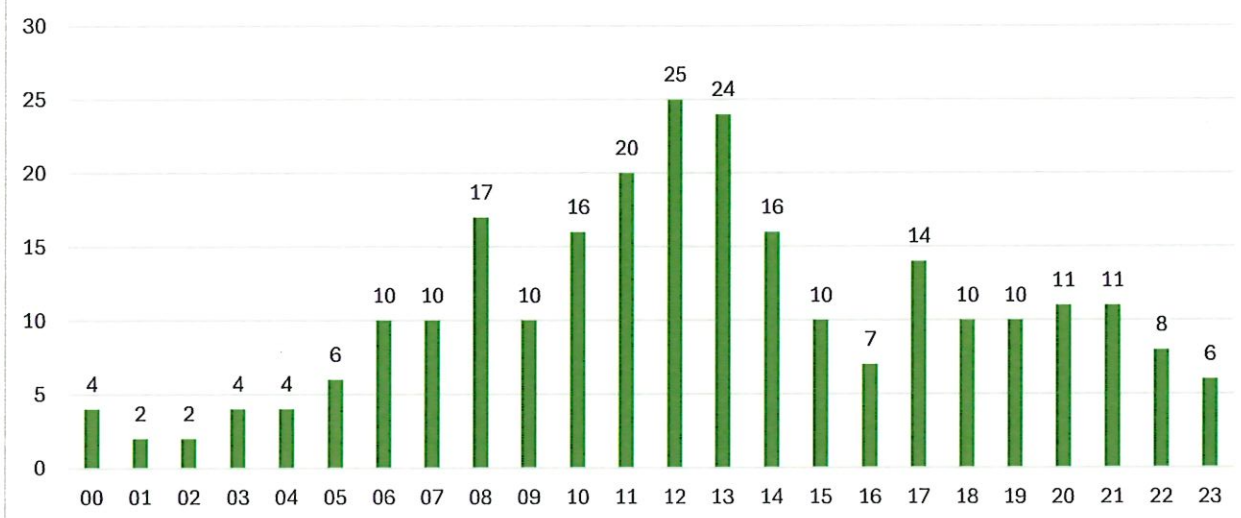

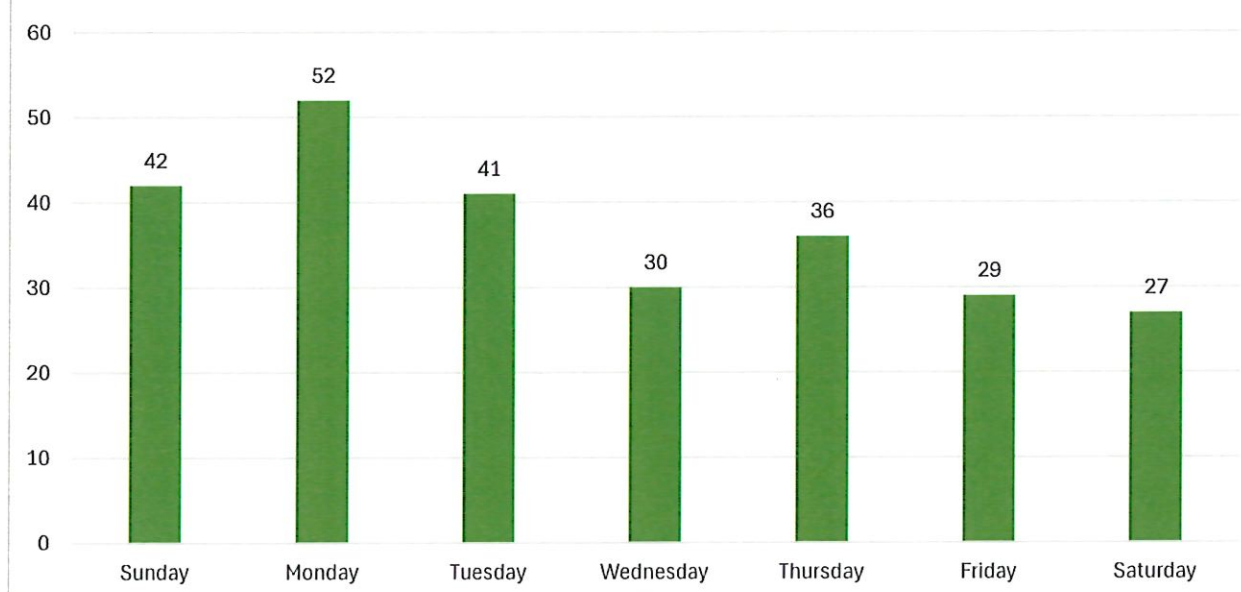

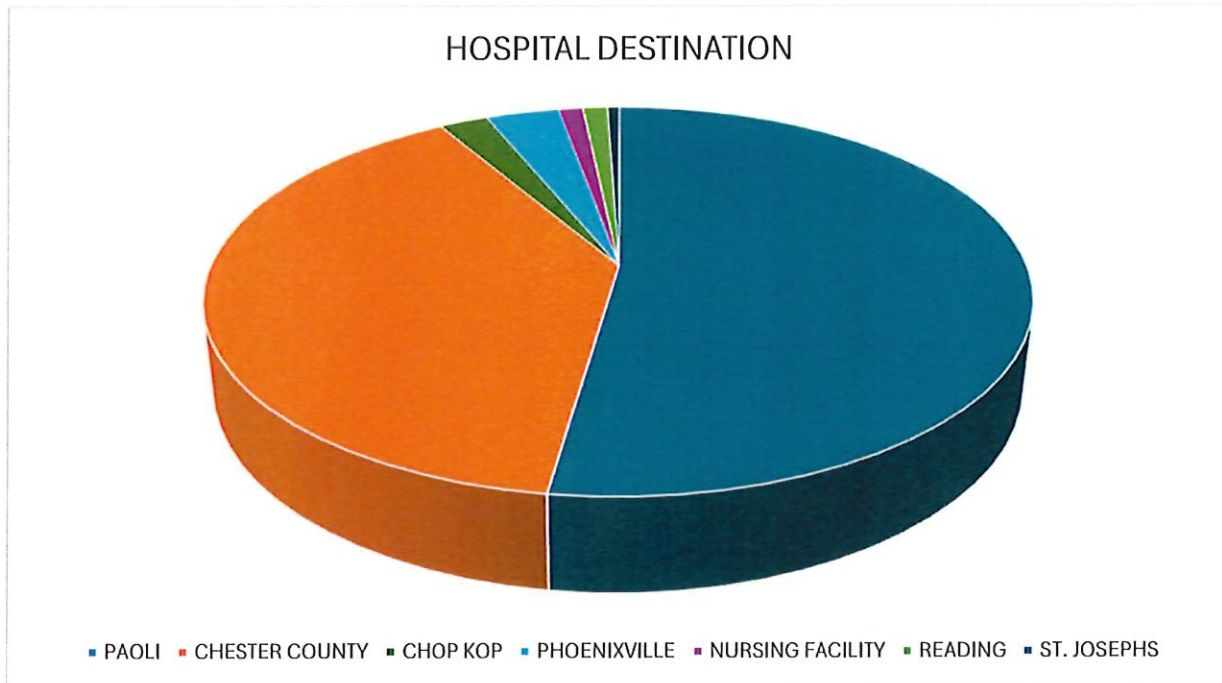
